- LCAP Student LCAP Input Session: Reviewed student answers.
- Discussed outdoor funding ideas:
 - Discussed chain link fence to wall off garden area by ASES portables, three poles for tennis and pickleball nets, and additional round tables and umbrellas for shaded seating. Team also discussed purchasing additional foam blocks for the primary and intermediate playgrounds, and other items for heavy lifting (social emotional supports). There is a need for more organized games during recess.
- Discussed Prop. 28 VAPA position and obtained input on focus area for 2023-2024 school year.
